We have since grown into a much larger space in room 45J (the office and meeting room for the Retirees' Association), still in the basement of the Student Centre, but much more adequately equipped.

Some of the treasures we have identified, catalogued, and filed:

- Copies of every yearbook, going back to the first issue published at W.O.I.T.;
- Copies of every issue of the student government newspaper, The Saint (until it went digital in 2017);
- A bound set of the Journalism student lab newspaper, the Journal;
- A complete set of every convocation program, back to the first convocation at W.O.I.T.;
- Thousands of photographs which have been identified and filed by category: staff, facilities, events and student;
- Important documents depicting historical College information such as basic documents, policies, staff directories, etc.

This is just a sampling of our collection, much of which still needs to be collected, identified, catalogued, and filed.

The material is in constant demand for events around the College, such as retirement parties; displays for the Retirees' display in the Main Lobby at South Campus, memorabilia for events such as reunions, etc. The largest single event was the 50th Anniversary of the College in 2017. The Archive group researched articles for events of interest, compiling a treasure chest of facts and items; contents for the new time capsule; photos for banners; articles for the College Facebook pages, etc.

Staff members retire and pass on material; display material from College activities is catalogued and filed rather than being sent to the disposal bin; photos are continually passed to us. We welcome your contributions – don't throw it out, let us take a look, and if it is not useable, let us throw out anything that might not add to our collection.

We are constantly in need of more 'hands' to help with the process of identifying, cataloguing, researching and filing what we have and what we hope to continue receiving. The group meets every Monday morning during the school year in 45J. Consider what you might do to enhance the retention of College history materials **

Stille Nacht! Heilige Nacht!

In 1816, Josef Mohr, a young priest serving as assistant pastor at the pilgrimage church in Mariapfarr, situated in the southeast corner of Salzburg, Austria province known as the Lungau region, wrote a poem about the birth of Jesus. No one knows what inspired the young priest to write the poem. The following year, 1817, when he was transferred to St. Nicholas Church in the village of Oberndorf bei Salzburg, Fr. Mohr took the poem with him.

The story goes that on Christmas Eve 1818, while preparing for that evening's Christmas Midnight Mass, Fr. Mohr discovered that the church organ was damaged – mice had eaten through the leather bellows that supplied air to the organ – and it could not be played. It appeared that there would be no music at Midnight Mass. Anxiously, Fr. Mohr went to see his musician-teacher friend Franz Xavier Gruber in the nearby village of Arnsdorf. He showed Franz the poem, and asked him to compose a melody for two solo voices, choir, and guitar accompaniment in order to sing it at Midnight Mass.

That evening, Fr. Mohr and Franz Gruber, accompanied by the church choir, stood in front of the main altar of the church and for the first time the world heard the sweet melody of *Stille Nacht! Heilige Nacht*. This famous Christmas carol that we know as *Silent Night*, *Holy Night*, born out of anxious necessity that Christmas Eve, is sung worldwide in many different languages - about 140 - every Christmas season.

In 1899, large parts of Oberndorf, including St. Nicholas Church suffered severe damage by flooding of the Salzach River. The villagers decided to rebuild the entire village further upstream, rebuilding the church in 1906, which in turn was demolished in 1913. To honour the memory of the carol, in 1924 the villagers began construction of a memorial chapel - shown in the photo below - completing construction in 1937. **

When St. Clair retirees renew their annual St. Clair College Retirees' Association membership with the payment of the \$10.00 fee, they are provided with the option of paying an additional \$10.00 for membership in OCRA.

The Executive encourages exercising this option for two reasons: to receive the OCRA materials outlining OCRA activity, and to support and strengthen the provincial organization.

Note: OCRA offers a Membership Status option of Lifetime Member. Go to the OCRA web site (https://ocraretirees.ca/registration/) if you are interested.

OCRA is only as strong and as effective as its membership numbers indicate. The greater the membership, the stronger OCRA's position when it comes to representing, and advocating for retirees in discussions with the CAAT Pension Plan, the Retiree Extended Health Benefit Plan, and with other related provincial groups such as the FSRA (Financial Services Regulatory Authority).



Bits 'N Pieces

St. Clair Sets New Enrolment Record

St. Clair College has hit a record enrolment number again this year by a razor-thin margin. The official Fall, 2019 count for full-time post-secondary students is 12,817, compared to 12,815 in 2018. When part-time students are added to the mix, the count increases to over 13,200 students.

The College is doing its part to boost its numbers in the downtown core, with large enrolment numbers in the School of Media, Art, and Design, the St. Clair College Centre for the Arts, and the Zekelman School of Business and IT. There are 2,836 students enrolled in the downtown programs, compared to just over 900 two years ago.

Overall, there was a four per cent increase in international students, for a total of 4,188 students. The number of domestic students totalled 7,552, which includes 1,227 at the Chatham campus. Another 1,077 students were taking classes at the ACE Acumen Academy in Toronto, where St. Clair College programs are offered through a public-private partnership.

Student Incidental Fees

The Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities created the "Student Choice" initiative that permits students to opt-out of non-essential fees. Through Student Fee Protocol, St. Clair College and its student groups established the following non-essential fees:

- Student Representative Council Membership Fee
- Thames Student Incorporated Membership Fee
- Alumni Association Membership Fee

Students were given the choice to opt-out from time of billing to September 16, 2019.

At St. Clair College 2,494 (19% of 12,817 students) chose to opt-out resulting in \$124,700 in lost fees.

Saint Clair College Revised Web Site

Beth Storey, who is the manager of IT Systems Services, invited the executives of the Retiree Association to a preview of the new Saint Clair College website. Ken Garber and I attended the meeting. We were fortunate to be able view and share ideas for the new design of the Retirees web pages and links with Beth's Web developer's team; Anthony Loncaric and Tim Johnston. The link to the Retirees' Association page is accessible from different areas. One is located on the Home Page under the menu item "About Us", and the other can be selected from a Saint Clair College list. You are still able to navigate to the Retirees Association web pages at www.stclaircollege.ca/retirees.

Some of new highlights include the Folklore web page which has been redesigned to list in alphabetical order all the Folklore videos. It is now at your fingertips to view any of the videos with a simple click. A new web page has been added called "Senior Wellness", which has the complete guide produced by the Province of Ontario, "A Guide to Program and Services for seniors in Ontario".

We extend our thanks to Beth and her team for including us in the design of the Retirees' web pages. We are very pleased with the new web design and hope you will be as well. **

Important Notice Regarding Retiree Parking Permits

As one of the benefits of Retiree Association Membership, St. Clair College provides complimentary parking for retirees. All current retiree parking tags **expire as of December 31, 2019** and must be renewed prior to that date to avoid receiving a parking ticket.

Change To Retiree Parking Passes

Instead of a three year renewal period, the **Retiree Parking Pass duration is being shortened to one year.** The opportunity for pass holders to renew begins November 1st and current passes expire on December 31st. This gives all pass holders two months to renew.

The renewal process is easy. To receive a new parking tag, present a completed Parking Application form (available from the Parking Office after November 1, 2019) and your 2020 Retiree Association Membership Card to the Parking Office in the Main Lobby and a new parking tag will be issued.

Retirees with a current Handicap Parking permit should present that permit to the Parking Desk when applying for the College Retiree parking tag. You will be issued with a College Retiree Handicap parking tag.
