A NOTE FOR SCCRA EMAIL LIST MEMBERS

A Heads-Up for SCCRA Email list members with Microsoft family addresses (Live.com, Hotmail.com/ca, Outlook.com, MSN.com,MAC.com). [Repeated from the previous newsletter]

Out of the last 8 broadcasts five of them have had delivery failures dues to spam filtering with Microsoft-family users. Check your account on your above listed server and see if you can unblock messages coming from retireesassociation@stclaircollege.ca and/or contain the subject text 'From the SCCRA'

You should also check Spam, Junk and Trash folders to see what's hiding. Some systems see the Spam folder and consider anything there legit and subject to filtering. One hint seen for GMail users is to not just delete messages in the Spam/Junk folder but instead MOVE them back to the Inbox so that they're properly marked as non-Spam.

If after checking your anti-spam filtering and various folders, and you still don't see any messages from the SCCRA, contact Marilyn at the email address above or at the mailing address on the website http://www.stclaircollege.ca/retirees/membership.html

If you have been getting messages but have been ignoring them, you can go to the link(s) found at the bottom of any broadcast and change your configuration:

"This email is intended for "your email address". Update your preferences or Unsubscribe.

A note for the GMail members on the Retiree e mail list.

If you use Gmail but have not been receiving the broadcasts from the Retiree List, here are some things you can do to check:

1. Reconfirm that your SPAM folder is empty. If there are any college messages there, you need to MOVE them back to the Inbox. Don't just delete them from the Spam folder. They may be permanently flagged.

- 2. Check your Gmail configuration settings:
- Click on Settings (the little gear in the top right corner).
- Click on Configure Inbox.

See if you enabled 'Tabs', so that certain emails are sitting elsewhere in your mailbox.

- Elsewhere in 'Settings', look at Filters & Blocked Addresses to see if you have anything configured. Remove them if they shouldn't be there.

3. If you use Incredimail to access your Gmail account, your account may not be syncing properly and your college email may be hidden. Use the Gmail login (gmail.com) to check your folders before going back to Incredimail.
